A Message from Pastor Gary ...



Parallel Seasons

The season of Lent is a season of repentance and self-examination. It is a time of preparation and discipline. It comes every year just like the other liturgical seasons. However, the word lent is and Ole English word that means spring, which also comes every year, and after a long winter it feels like resurrection.

Resurrection is a word that is associated with Easter, and we associate Easter with spring far more than we associate Lent with spring. That might be because Lent starts in the winter and is usually coming to completion in the spring. It is as if the liturgical seasons and the climatic seasons are overlaid upon one another but are not completely aligned.

Even with the lack of full alignment, the climatic seasons of winter and spring still help us understand the liturgical seasons of Lent and Easter. The winter was dead and dark and challenging. It required a great disciple to endure. Lent required us to die to self, to reflect on the dark sides of ourselves. We were challenged and it took discipline to endure. The spring brings us life, and light. It brings us warmth and relief. Plants and flowers are blooming around us. Easter brings us new life and light. Our hearts begin to warm up to the reality of a God who loves us, who delivers us, who is faithful, and who will always come through no matter how dismal our situation appears to be.

It feels so good to have the 'winter of our discontent' behind us, and to return to the spring of our youth. It's time to allow our hearts to open to the joy of Easter and resurrection.





New Memorial Gift Opportunities Peace Church - Landscape Revitalization and Upgrades

You may remember that East Rockhill Township made several concessions to us in the permitting and construction of the Pavilion. The major concession, waiving land development, allowed us to proceed without the landscaping buffers that would normally be a requirement of construction. That saved Peace some money but left us without some items that we might wish to have.

Sandy Miller, in addition to being our full-time early service usher and communion assistant is, in his other life, a landscape architect. I think most of us know the Millers, Sandy and Cindy best for their Dahlias which they so generously share with us in the late summer and early fall.

Sandy donated his professional services in preparing a landscape plan for Peace. On that plan he includes a revitalization of the existing shrubbery around d the church. His plan also includes buffer plantings to screen the Pavilion from the road and the neighboring property. Had the Township not waived land development, the buffers would have been a requirement of the permit. His plan includes other plantings on the south west corner of the pavilion where we have a somewhat overgrown landscaped berm in need of regrading and new plantings. He also shows a paver block patio on that same corner. That patio is not under consideration with this appeal.

This landscape work is not essential to our mission at Peace. It is however, a visual statement reflecting our attitude and pride in what we do here. Peace has, since the construction of our current sanctuary, maintained an appearance that speaks to of our commitment to our mission in this place. Do to difficult financial times in the life of Peace, and in the lives of many of our members, we have not included this landscape work in our regular budgeting, nor do we propose taking it from our current or future building monies.

What we are doing is making that landscape work available for special donations or memorial gifts by those with the ability and inclination to fund some of this landscaping work. We do not want you to divert funds from your regular envelope obligations. Sandy Miller has broken the work into a few smaller projects and attached a budget price for each. We are making this work available to the congregation or other benefactors as special gifts or memorials. When enough funds are accumulated, we will complete selected portions of the work under the direction of Sandy Miller.

Please consider this project as a memorial gift or as a home for any leftover money you have lying around after filling your envelope and donating to your regular charitable concerns.

Dear Friends,

Let's celebrate with our team in Thailand who reached their 25th anniversary. Our Daily Bread Ministries was established in Thailand in 1997 with the hope that our devotional booklet would connect Thai people with the Word of God. Our team has remained steady in their commitment to share the gospel during the past three years of intense global events that have led to increased cost of living and unemployment in Thailand.

Their ministry is reaching many through their Turn Prison into Heaven program, using Our Daily Bread Ministries' resources to reach people in prison. Thailand has a high rate of imprisonment: the 3rd highest rate of imprisonment in Asia, according to the World Prison Population List (2021).

There are 143 prisons in Thailand and 261,400 inmates (as of Nov. 2022). The Thailand team has shared God's Word to more than 22,000 inmates. There are about 6,700 people who have decided to accept Jesus and 11,000 have subscribed to receive *Our Daily Bread*. In the last two years, the Thai office produced 10,000 copies of the *Our Daily Bread* special edition for inmates, and more than 8,000 copies have been distributed.

What a joy it is to minister with this team. Thank you for making this ministry possible through your gifts. Let's pray for their continued diligence and their responsiveness to the Holy Spirit's movement in Thailand.
