Miracles

From the Archives

The church office received a call recently, asking for information about the church parsonage. Parsonage? I thought to myself. I didn't know Peace ever had a parsonage. Turns out, this gentlemen lives in a 1780's home in Tylersport which he believes may have been the parsonage belonging to the parish of Old Goshenhoppen at the time when Rev. Conrad Roeller was the pastor.

Back in those days, churches had little money and pastors were hard to come by, as they had to be trained in Germany. Peace-Tohickon joined with Old Goshenhoppen and Indianfield to which became Rev Roeller's residence. Roeller actually farmed the land in addition to his church responsibilities to earn extra income.

In 1841, Rev. Engelbert Peixolo became pastor of the parish and lived on the farm. There is no record of whether or not he farmed it.

The last pastor to live on the farm was Rev. Frederick Walz. He moved into the parsonage in 1864 but lived there for only 2 years. In 1866, he purchased a house in Sellersville, and the Tylersport property was sold.

I relayed this information to our caller and he was very grateful to get it. It's so rewarding to be able to inform the public about the history of our church!

We have started the new school year with a bang! We are already serving 290 children! We are still working out of three pantries: Blooming Glen Mennonite (Bedminster, Guth and North Middle), St. Paul's UCC (Deibler, West Rockhill, South Middle and Pennridge High School) and Souderton Brethren in Christ (Sellersville, Seylar, Grasse and Central Middle).

We supported FISH this summer who in turn supported our children. There is new leadership at FISH and lots of changes, so please keep them in your prayers and watch social media for lists of needs and ways you can help.

We have welcomed a few new teams to our packing schedule and continue to receive generous donations from MANY local churches (St. Michael's Lutheran, Trinity Lutheran, St. Paul's UCC, St. Andrew's UCC, St. Matthews Lutheran, Good Shepherd, Peace Lutheran, St. Andrew's Lutheran, Blooming Glen Mennonite, Perkasie Mennonite, JUST TO NAME SOME).

We are going to have a COMMUNITY-WIDE food drive this year for the first time. We will kick it off on MLK Day, Monday, January 20, 2025, at Pennridge High School, then each school will be collecting food and there will be boxes around the community where you can drop food donations until Friday, February 14, 2025.

I realize this news seems to be a little premature, but as most of you know, TIME passes QUICKLY! Before we know, it will be Christmas, followed by MLK Day very soon after.
